#### No new Jaguars to sell in New Zealand for one year

Amid grand changes to its line-up and the direction of its brand positioning, the local arm of Jaguar has confirmed that the marque is expected to have a 12-month new-product hiatus in New Zealand once stocks of current models finish up.

Motorcorp Distributors chief executive Steve Kenchington — who is set to imminently take on the role of CEO of Giltrap Group — told media in Auckland that Jaguar will run out its current line-up locally in 2025, before commencing a hiatus as it waits for new models to arrive.

"Jaguar for 2025 will be on run out, and then there will be a hiatus for probably 12 months post that before we start to see anything coming into production, which will obviously be the UK and US first," said Kenchington.



The Jaguar F-Pace is the only current Jaguar still in production.

As previously reported, Jaguar's current line-up has been culled as it prepares to debut an all-new line-up constructed with new platforms — a move that includes a radical shift in the brand's positioning and marketing.

# Jaguar's bold shift: NZ dealers to focus on Land Rover as Jaguar dramatically u turns to super luxury

The future of Jaguar and Land Rover in New Zealand is undergoing a significant shift, as the brands navigate an ever-changing automotive landscape with a new pair of hands on the wheel.

Ben Montgomery took over from outgoing Motorcorp boss Steve Kenchington on the 1st of February, as the latter embarks on a new role as CEO of the Giltrap Group. Montgomery takes the reins at Motorcorp

as Land Rover sales continue to hit new levels, thanks to the success of new Range Rover models and the ongoing high demand for Defender, but it is also at a pivotal time for Jaguar both locally and globally.



Jaguar is undergoing a major transformation, repositioning itself in the super-luxury segment to take on the likes of Bentley and Aston Martin. As a result, the brand will be on run out in 2025, followed by a hiatus of about 12 months before new models are released, with the UK and US markets being prioritised initially.

While Jaguar transitions to this new segment, Kenchington says Land Rover will fill the gaps in the market with other products. Existing retailers will become Land Rover dealerships, and a determination will be made on which of those retailers will take on the Jaguar brand nearer the arrival of the new models.

Montgomery says the new Jaguar will be a "high price" and "low volume" vehicle that will see the need for a different approach in the New Zealand market.

"I think we're going to have to go find new customers. And if we don't find new customers, any brand, doesn't matter what you are, if you don't find them, you die," he said.

Our thanks, once again, to Geoff & Val for their famous strawberries.














## Top of the South Motor Show Saturday 22nd February 2025 at Richmond Park








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
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
