How an Automatic Transmission works



Saturday 19th October

- Meet at Z Hautapu 9.45am, briefing, answer questions, Depart 10am,
- Drive towards Taupo avoiding SH1, via Maungatautari, Arapuni, Mangakino, to Whakamaru and Tihoi Junction (93km, 1.15-1.45 hours)
- Stop for coffee at the **Dam Café**, Whakamaru Junction 11.15 12 noon


Club "Workshop Manual" Library
